January 18, 2024 1:00-3:00pm : **"The Burnt-Out Town of Miracles" by Roy Jacobsen** 2024 begins with the Vesterheim Book group reading another Roy Jacobsen novel. The story recounts life in Suomussalmi, Finland after the villagers have burned their village and retreated into the country side to fight the advancing Russians during World War II. So the story begins. Timo Vatanen is the village logger [and village idiot] who has a farm near town and delivers firewood to townsfolk. Timo refuses to leave with the other villagers when the Russians arrive and have need of firewood for a brutally cold winter. Timo delivers firewood to the Russians using a hapless group of six wanderers. Jacobsen delivers a story of "unexpected bravery, feats of survival, and the powerful and forbidden friendships forged during the war". One reviewer said "a powerful and well-written account of an unfamiliar episode in the Second World War."

Hello, high school seniors and current college students.

It's time to start thinking about 2024!

If you are a member of Sons of Norway or have a parent or grandparent who is a member, you can apply for a scholarship from the Sons of Norway Foundation.

There are a variety of scholarships available for college, trade schools, and study abroad, from \$1,500 to \$20,000+.

Go to the Sons of Norway website at <u>www.sofn.com</u> and click on Foundation. Then click on Scholarships and read about each one and who is eligible to apply. When you find one or more for which you qualify, read the Overview, Who Can Apply, and View Guidelines.

Some are due January 15 and some you have until February 15 to apply.

Now, think about what you have to do to apply . . . and here are a few suggestions:

1.Treat the application as if it is a job application. Be thorough in completing all requirements of the application.

2. Make a list of all the application requirements and check them off when completed. Then, double check before submitting. If any requirement is not completed, your application will automatically be rejected.

3. Read and study the Criteria section of the application. In your essay, you are asked to address six (6) key points. Use specific, experiential examples when answering these key points, especially your connection to Sons of Norway.

4. How did you find out about the Sons of Norway Foundation scholarship and/or what do you know about the Sons of Norway Foundation? Show you did more research than just a Google search.

5. Emphasize your community or school volunteer work.

We are excited to bring these opportunities to you! We believe you have the potential to be an excellent candidate. The applications are due in several months and we hope you start now to create a compelling application.

NORWEGIAN GAP YEAR

Norwegian folk high schools in Norway are unlike anything we have in North America.

Think of them as an organized gap year. It gives students an opportunity to dedicate a year to something they're passionate about or to discover new passions. It can also work as a sort of technical school; it all just depends on which subject of study that you choose. Folk high schools stand out because they offer a wide variety of subjects, no final exams, freedom, self-motivation and a focus on selfdevelopment.

Danish writer and pastor Nikolai Frederik Severin Grundtvig came up with the concept of the folk high school. His idea was based on the fact that students needed "lifelong learning" skills in order to succeed. He liked the English Boarding School concept and mixed that with popular education and enlightenment rather than the formal education curriculum.

Norway's first folk high school was formed in 1864 and now there are 85 folk high schools around the country. About a third of these schools have a religious focus but all vary according to subjects and location.
