## 10th MOUNTAIN DIVISION MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY Monday, May 29




**Location**: At the summit of Tennessee Pass on US Highway 24, between Leadville and Minturn, Colorado, at the 10th Mountain Division Monument.

## **NEWS FROM SCANDINAVIA**

#### NEW TREATMENT FOR SOCIAL ANXIETY

Scientists at the world-renowned Karolinska Institute in Stockholm have discovered that sniffing someone else's body odor might just be the ticket!

They found that women who were exposed to the smell of armpit sweat (from volunteers) had a better response to their social anxiety mindfulness therapy than those who weren't exposed.

Here's how the test went: Volunteers donated armpit sweat from when they were either watching a happy movie or a scary one. 48 women in the mindfulness therapy group agreed to sniff the samples for two days while continuing their therapy sessions. The control group sniffed clean air, and the other two groups the sweat. Those who were exposed to the sweat did better in the therapy than those exposed to the clean air (39% versus 17% in anxiety reduction.) And strangely enough, it didn't matter if the sweat came from the volunteer who was watching the scary or the happy movie. A possible conclusion is that they maybe reacting to a human chemical in sweat generally which has a calming affect.

More research is coming.

#### WORLD'S TALLEST TIMBER BUILDING

For years it had been the opinion of American engineers that you shouldn't exceed 3 stories for a wooden structure. Now engineers are thinking otherwise. In Brumunddal Norway stands the Tower of Mjosa, a modern 18 story mixed-use wooden "plyscraper". At first the locals referred to it as "the world's largest torch." But they should be proven wrong. The building's strength and stability depend not on steel and concrete but on giant Glulam beams, manufactured from local lumber. Glulam is a stress-rated engineered wood beam composed of wood laminations, or "lams", that are bonded together under heat and pressure with durable, water-resistant adhesive. In Norway it is mass produced from the spruce and pine that cover about a third of the country. By Norwegian law the trees used must be replaced. Glulam chars but is not totally consumed by fire.

Upscale sprinkler systems are used throughout, holding more water than typical systems. There are separate fire safety systems to control the spread of fire both vertically and horizontally, adhering to Norway's strict regulations.
